## PROGRAM OVERVIEW







#### **Initiative Overview**

- BJA seeks to support small and rural agencies in their efforts to combat violent crime through the <u>FY24 Rural and</u> <u>Small Department Violent Crime Reduction Program</u>.
- This program provides funding to small and/or rural agencies to implement or enhance the capacity of their organization around one or more critical elements found in the <u>Violent Crime Reductions Operations Guide</u> or the <u>Prosecutors' Guide to Reducing Violence and Building Safer</u> <u>Communities</u>.



#### **Activities**

Complete the *Violent Crime Reduction Operations Guide* online assessment tool.

Select one or more of the critical elements within the Guide to improve capacity as part of an overall violent crime reduction strategy.

Partner with a researcher or subject matter expert to monitor the activities identified for the project.



#### **Activities**

Implement programming and activities that reflect an enhanced capacity, per the Guide.

Deploy agency resources such as personnel, services, or analytical tools that meet the capacity enhancement goal.

Document the development and implementation of strategies to reduce the violent crime problem(s) identified in the application.



## **Violent Crime Reduction Operations Guide**

- The Guide outlines Critical Elements that discuss important capabilities for any agency in its fight against violent crime, including the most essential, overarching element: leadership.
- Law enforcement leaders can use this Guide and its Critical Elements as a resource to assess their agency's capacity and identify additional actions that can assist them in their fight against violent crime.

# ELIGIBILITY AND APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS







## **Eligibility**

- This solicitation is limited to small and/or rural law enforcement agencies and prosecutors serving rural communities or small departments.
- The following entities are eligible to apply for this funding opportunity:
  - A small agency is any law enforcement agency with 250 or fewer sworn officers.
  - A rural agency, as defined under this initiative, is (a) an agency serving any area or community, no part of which is within an area designated as a standard metropolitan statistical area by the Office of Management and Budget or (b) any agency serving one or more rural census tracts.
  - A tribal agency is any federally recognized tribe with a designated law enforcement agency.



## **Available Funding**

- \$300,000 maximum dollar amount.
- 15 anticipated awards.
- Funding begins October 1, 2024, for 36 months.



## **Previous Program Funding**

Previous funding through this program has been used to support efforts to combat various rural violent crime challenges, including:



Assaults, robberies, and sexual assaults



Homicides



Narcotics-related violent crime



Intimate partner violence



Gang-related violent crime



Firearms-related violent crime



Child abuse and exploitation



## Things to Keep in Mind

- Applicants should reference the <u>Violent Crime</u>
   <u>Reductions Operations Guide</u> or the <u>Prosecutors' Guide</u>
   <u>to Reducing Violence and Building Safer Communities</u>
   throughout their application as stated in the solicitation.
- The program timeline should highlight and include major milestones and deliverables.

#### OJP Grant Application Resource Guide



#### ▲ SAM.gov Entity Validation Update ℰ

GSA implemented a new process to validate an entity's legal business name and physical address when requesting a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) and for completing a SAM.gov entity registration. Due to a high volume of requests, entity validations are taking longer than expected to process. This validation process is now taking 7-10 business days, and in some cases longer.

OJP strongly recommends starting your SAM.gov registration process as soon as possible to allow the time necessary to process entity validations well in advance of the Grants.gov due date posted in the solicitation. Read this FAQ for more information.

The Office of Justice Programs (OJP) Grant Application Resource Guide ("Guide") provides guidance to assist OJP grant applicants in preparing and submitting applications for OJP funding. It addresses a variety of policies, statutes, and regulations that apply to many (or in some cases, all) OJP program applicants, or to grants and cooperative agreements awarded in fiscal year (FY) 2023. Some OJP programs may have program solicitations that expressly modify a provision of this Guide; in such cases, the applicant is to follow the guidelines in the solicitation as to any such expressly modified provision.



- Step 1: Submit an SF-424 and an SF-LLL at Grants.gov.
- Step 2: Submit the full application, with attachments, at <u>JusticeGrants.usdoj.gov</u>.

NOTE: Submission deadline times for both Grants.gov and JustGrants are now 8:59 p.m. ET, not 11:59 p.m. ET as in past years.

Read the solicitation carefully for further guidance.
